Arenas and a colleague provided a detailed list of problems faced by workers and the owners' tactics to prevent unionization.

The union presented a pledge to support the boycott that it is requesting organizations to sign on to. A motion was made and seconded to support the boycott pledge by the PHDC. While the members present strongly supported the motion, it was not approved because there was not a quorum. VP Tony Kelly said that he would take it to the Executive Committee for its review and action.

- 2. Tony Kelly announced the play, "White Rabbit/ Red Rabbit," and urged attendance the proceeds from the night he performs (June 5) as the sole actor will benefit the SF Arts Democratic Club.
- 3. Tony Kelly thanked Sophie Maxwell for the door hangers printed for the June 7th election and sought volunteers to distribute them in the next 2 weeks. Volunteers are asked to contact Tony Kelly.
- 4. The June 7th meeting will be both a primary watch event and a party to celebrate Joni Eisen as she steps down as club president. It will be her last meeting as president. Tentatively it will be Il Pirata on 16th St.
